- If your project failed six months from now, what would be the most likely cause?
- What early warning signs would you want your team to watch for?
- What preventive actions could you take now to reduce the risk?

6 Steps to Keep Long Projects on Course – Helene Segura

- Which of your long-running projects feels most at risk of drifting off track?
- What checkpoints or milestones could you strengthen or add?
- Where could you simplify communication to avoid delays and overwhelm?

- What conversations could help surface hidden concerns or needs?
- How might engaging certain stakeholders earlier change project outcomes?
